

Key Stage 1 - Pupils should be taught about:

- changes within living memory (Y1 Toys old and new)
- events beyond living memory (Y2 Great fire of London)
- the lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements, some should be used to compare aspects of life in different periods [for example, Elizabeth I and Queen Victoria, Christopher Columbus and Neil Armstrong, William Caxton and Tim Berners-Lee, Pieter Bruegel the Elder and LS Lowry, Rosa Parks and Emily Davison, Mary Seacole and/or Florence Nightingale and Edith Cavell] (Y2 Florence Nightingale and or Mary Seacole)
- significant historical events, people and places in their own locality (Y1 Toys Abbey House Museum & Kings and Queens)

Key Stage 2 - Pupils should be taught about:

- changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age (Y3)
- the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain (Y4)
- Britain's settlement by Anglo-Saxons and Scots (Y5)
- the Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the Kingdom of England to the time of Edward the Confessor (Y5)
- a local history study (Y4 Romans & York)
- a study of an aspect or theme in British history that extends pupils' chronological knowledge beyond 1066 (Y5 Tudors and Elizabeth I, Y6 Victorians & WWII)
- the achievements of the earliest civilizations an overview of where and when the first civilizations appeared and a depth study of one of the following: Ancient Sumer, The Indus Valley, <u>Ancient Egypt</u> (Y3), The <u>Shang Dynasty</u> of Ancient China (Y4)
- Ancient Greece a study of Greek life and achievements and their influence on the western world (Y4)
- a non-European society that provides contrasts with British history one study chosen from: early Islamic civilization, including a study of Baghdad c. AD 900; Mayan civilization c. AD 900; Benin (West Africa) c. AD 900-1300 (Y5)
