PlanIt Spanish Reduced Content Teaching Guidance

PlanIt Spanish offers a carefully planned sequence of lessons, ensuring progressive coverage of the skills required by the national curriculum. It aims to foster children's curiosity and help deepen their understanding of the world. PlanIt Spanish aims to expose children to authentic Spanish, so the scheme offers regular opportunities to listen to native speakers. Through our PlanIt Spanish scheme, we inspire children to develop a love of languages and to expand their horizons to other countries, cultures and people. We want to help children grow into curious, confident and reflective language learners.

While PlanIt Spanish has been designed with hourly teaching sessions in mind, we understand that many schools do not have a full hour each week allocated to the teaching of MFL. This document has been created to show that it is possible to teach reduced content from across our key stage 2 units, while still covering all of the objectives in the national curriculum.

In the overview, we have suggested specific units of teaching from our units across all 4 year groups, which will still offer a well-sequenced progression. Each unit can be taught over a term, rather than over a half term, allowing three units to be covered each year at a slower pace. This offers more time and opportunities for practising using and applying new learning through a range of speaking, listening, reading and writing activities. Teaching these units over a longer period of time, with more occasions for revisiting the new language learnt, will help children to retain new knowledge and skills.

This document provides an overview of a selection of Plant Spanish units from across KS2, including their titles, key vocabulary and grammar taught in each unit and the links to the national curriculum for each area. We have selected twelve units that will allow coverage of all twelve national curriculum objectives over the four years.
