Key Knowledge and Grammar

Nouns:

- Masculine Nouns: **un** precedes (singular noun) and **unos** precedes (plural noun).
- Feminine Nouns: **una** precedes (singular noun) and **unas** precedes (plural noun).

Adjective rules:

- **Adjectives** that end in **-o** in the masculine singular form end in **-a** in the feminine singular form, e.g. **rojo/roja** [red (m/f)].
- **Adjectives** that end in **-e** in the masculine singular form also end in **-e** in the feminine singular form, e.g. **verde** [green (m/f)].
- **Adjectives** that end in a **consonant** are the same in the masculine and feminine singular forms, e.g. **gris** [grey (m/f)].
- **Adjective Exceptions:** Some colours stay the same whether they are masculine, feminine or plural: **naranja** [orange], **rosa** [pink] and **violeta** [purple].
