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What should I already know?

- Knowledge of the organisation of CAFOD and how it helps to support some injustices which affect people living in different parts of the world.
- Participation in debates which have involved discussing events that may have happened in school or in the wider world which are perceived as being unjust.

What will I know at the end of the unit?

- Know that the prophets spoke out about injustice e.g., Elijah, John the Baptist.
- Show understanding of how their own and other's decisions are informed by beliefs about injustice.
- Show understanding of the Incarnation in the 'Hail Mary' prayer by making links between ٠ the belief and its biblical sources e.g., the Annunciation and the Visitation.
- Show understanding of injustice by making links between beliefs and life. ٠
- Show an understanding of the Incarnation using sources in scripture to answer the . question 'What kind of king is Jesus?'
- Recognising difference, comparing, and contrasting their own and other people's ٠ responses to questions about justice.
- Show knowledge and understanding of the life and work of key figures in the history of ٠ the people of God e.g., Oscar Romero, Martin Luther King, Dorothy Day.
