



What should I already know?

- Knowledge of the organisation of CAFOD and how it helps to support some injustices which affect people living in different parts of the world.
- Participation in debates which have involved discussing events that may have happened in school or in the wider world which are perceived as being unjust.

What will I know at the end of the unit?

- Know that the prophets spoke out about injustice e.g., Elijah, John the Baptist.
- Show understanding of how their own and other's decisions are informed by beliefs about injustice.
- Show understanding of the Incarnation in the 'Hail Mary' prayer by making links between the belief and its biblical sources e.g., the Annunciation and the Visitation.
- Show understanding of injustice by making links between beliefs and life.
- Show an understanding of the Incarnation using sources in scripture to answer the question 'What kind of king is Jesus?'
- Recognising difference, comparing, and contrasting their own and other people's responses to questions about justice.
- Show knowledge and understanding of the life and work of key figures in the history of the people of God e.g., Oscar Romero, Martin Luther King, Dorothy Day.

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| Advent | Liturgical season of the Catholic church waiting for the birth of Jesus. |
| CAFOD | A charity. The initials stand for Catholic Agency For Overseas Development |
| Compassion | A feeling of concern that makes you want to help. |
| Elijah | A prophet |
| Fairness | To treat a person correctly |
| injustice | To be unfair |
| Justice | To be fair |
| John the Baptist | Jesus' cousin and a prophet |
| Martyr | Someone who gives their life for their faith |
| Prophet | A holy person who hears God's word and tells others about it. |
| Reconciliation | Forgiveness |
| Refugees | A person who is forced to leave their country because of war or injustice. |
| Segregation | To separate people from another unjustly. |
| Wreath | A circular arrangement of flowers and leaves. |
