



What should I already know?

- That Jesus performed miracles
- That a miracle is something wonderful that seems impossible
- That people followed Jesus

What will I know at the end of the unit?

Calmed	Not moving; still
Faith for Christians	Belief in God, in all he has said and revealed to us
Healed	To make healthy
Kindness	being friendly, generous, and considerate.
Miracle	When God does something wonderful that seems impossible
Storm	Strong weather that brings rain, wind, thunder, or lightning
Trust	When we can be sure that someone will only do what is good for us
Wonder	to want to know or be curious about.
