

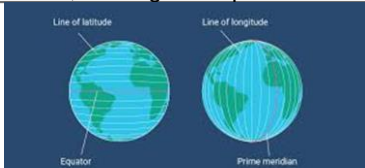


What should I already know?

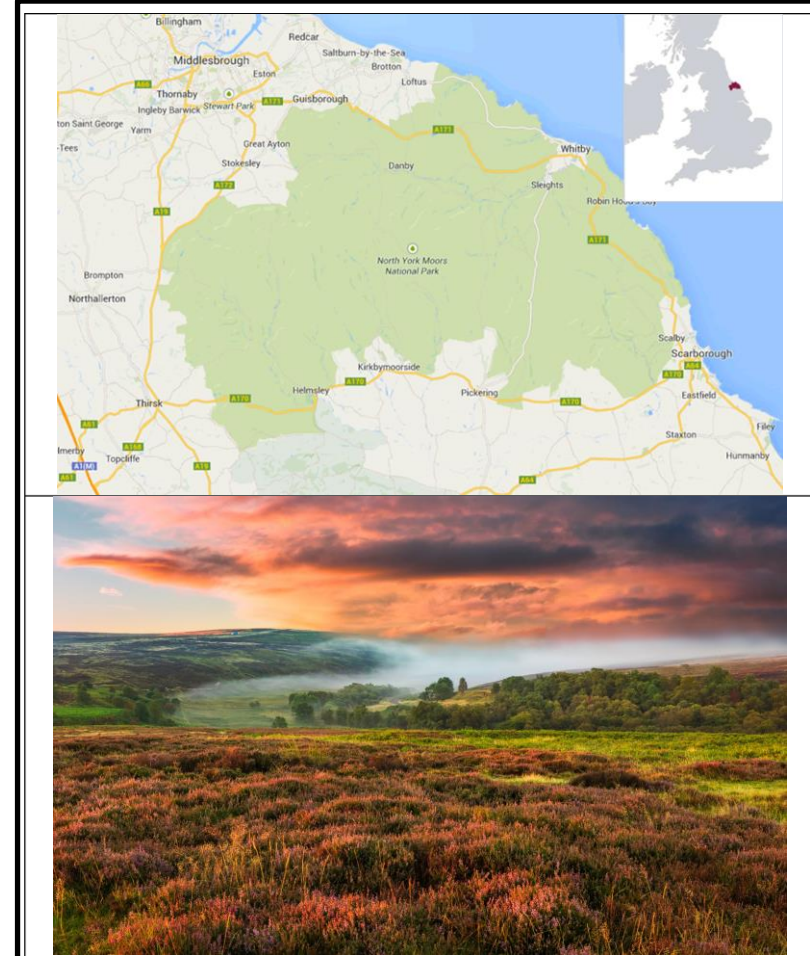
What will I know at the end of the unit?

- I can use Ordnance Survey map symbols and 6 figure grid references to build my knowledge of the United Kingdom

I can use world maps, atlases and globes to locate counties and cities and describe features selected.
I can observe, measure, and record human and physical features using a range of methods e.g. sketch maps, plans, graphs, and digital technologies.

I can analyse, interpret and present data collected from fieldwork observations, measurements and recordings.
I can interpret a wider range of information, including scale projections, thematic, and digital maps.
