| cartographer | somebody who draws and produces maps cartographer <br> somebody who draws and produces maps | landscape | everything you can see when you look across an area of land, <br> including hills, rivers, buildings, trees, and plants. |
| compass <br> points | any of the main points of a compass: north, south, east, west, <br> north-east, north-west, south-east, south-west compass points | latitude | Lines that circle Earth parallel to the Equator. The Equator is an <br> imaginary line that lies halfway between the North Pole and the <br> South Pole. It runs east-west all the way around Earth. |
| county | a region of Britain or Ireland which has its own local government | population | all the people who live in a country or area |
| human <br> features | features of land that have been impacted by human activity | topographical | the physical features of an area of land, for example its hills, <br> valleys, and rivers |
| longitude | Imaginary lines that run around the Earth vertically (up and down) <br> and meet at the North and South Poles | village | a group of houses and associated buildings, larger than a <br> hamlet and smaller than a town, situated in a rural area. |
