can use Ordnance Survey map symbols and 6 figure grid references to build my knowledge of the United Kingdom


can name and locate counties and cities of the United Kingdom, geographical regions and their human and physical characteristics.


can use world maps, atlases and globes to locate counties and cities and describe features selected.


I can observe, measure, and record human and physical features using a range of methods e.g. sketch maps, plans, graphs, and digital technologies.

cartographer	somebody who draws and produces maps cartographer somebody who draws and produces maps	landscape	everything you can see when you look across an area of land, including hills, rivers, buildings, trees, and plants.
compass points	any of the main points of a compass: north, south, east, west, north-east, north-west, south-east, south-west compass points	latitude	Lines that circle Earth parallel to the Equator. The Equator is an imaginary line that lies halfway between the North Pole and the South Pole. It runs east-west all the way around Earth.
county	a region of Britain or Ireland which has its own local government	population	all the people who live in a country or area
human features	features of land that have been impacted by human activity	topographical	the physical features of an area of land, for example its hills, valleys, and rivers
longitude	Imaginary lines that run around the Earth vertically (up and down) and meet at the North and South Poles	village	a group of houses and associated buildings, larger than a hamlet and smaller than a town, situated in a rural area.
