What should I already know?

- The children will build on previous topics from Reception and Year 2 about Lent and The Good News.
- Children will have had opportunities to reflect on their friendships and how, after they fall out, they put things right again.
 Children will know what it means to forgive somebody.

What will I know at the end of the unit?

- I can retell one of Jesus' stories of forgiveness, ensuring it is accurate in its sequence and detail.
- I can describe with increasing detail and accuracy the beliefs that Christians hold about God, from the stories of forgiveness.
- I can make a simple link between the stories of forgiveness and beliefs about Reconciliation.
- I can make a simple link between the beliefs Christians hold about Lent (Lenten promise, three Christian duties- prayer, fasting, and almsgiving) and how it affects their behaviour.
- When considering the stories of Zacchaeus and the Lost Son, I can suggest answers to questions like, 'Why is forgiveness so amazing?' Is change easy or hard? Why? Why does forgiveness sometimes seem unfair? Is it?'
- I can make a simple link between the beliefs Catholics hold about the Sacrament of Reconciliation and how it affects my behaviour.
