

What should I already know?

- How to make the Sign of the Cross and its use in the sacrament of Baptism
- The story of Jesus’s birth, Mary and her role in Jesus’ birth
- The story of the Annunciation
- That God is our Father in Heaven

What will I know at the end of the unit?

- Describe the mystery of God as Trinity, using religious words.
- Describe what the stories of the Annunciation, visit of the shepherds/wise men, tells us all about Jesus.
- Describe some religious symbols of Advent and Christmas.
- Talk about and ask questions about God as three in one.
- Ask and answer questions about the feelings of the characters in the stories.
- Ask and answer questions about what Advent and the Christmas story can teach them about the virtues of patience, generosity and kindness.
- Recognise that some questions are hard to answer.
- Retell the Annunciation or the visit of the shepherds/wise men.
- Give 4 examples of how the Christmas story is used in church and at home.
- Suggest answers to questions such as ‘Is it better to be a wise man or shepherd?’
- Explore a question like ‘what’s the best thing about Christmas?’ Why?

Engaged	When two people promise to marry each other.

Manger	A wooden box that has grass in it for animals to eat.
Mystery	A mystery is something we can worry about.
Praise	To tell someone that they are really good at something.
Saviour	A name for Jesus, because he came to save everyone.
Trinity	God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit
Advent Wreath	A circle of leaves or flowers
