2.3 THE GOOD NEWS

What should I already know?

- Various miracle stories from The Gospels including: The calming of the storm (Mk 4: 35-41); Curing a paralysed man (Mk 2: 1-12); and making a blind man see (Mk 10: 46-52).
- How to reflect on The Good News of Jesus in our lives and how it makes us feel.

What will I know at the end of the unit?

- Retell, in any form, at least two religious stories on the theme of the Good News.
- Give examples of how to follow the teachings about forgiveness and bringing good news to the friendless.
- Use religious words like – good news, Jesus, miracle, Jairus, believe, cure, heal, leper, leprosy, disease, bread, fish, Lent.
- Give clear, simple descriptions of what these stories tell us about God.
- Ask and answer questions about the feelings and experiences of characters in the stories.
- Give examples of how our beliefs in God can be put into practise e.g charity, visiting the sick, saying thank you and sending thank you cards.
- Answer questions like 'Are our actions more important than our words'. 'Why?'

Believe	To have faith in something you do not know
Cure	To make someone better when they have been ill
Disease	An illness or sickness
Forgiveness	When someone pardons you for something you have done wrong.
Good News	News that makes you happy. The Good News about Jesus is that he loves us and came back to life after he died.
Heal	To make a sick person better.
Joy	A feeling of great happiness.
Leper	A person affected by a disease called leprosy
Leprosy	An illness that affects the skin and nerves.
Lent	Season in the Church's year when we prepare for Easter.
Miracle	Something that is impossible for us to do so it is something God does. It requires our faith in God /Jesus
Paralysed	A person who is unable to move or feel a part or parts of their body.
Power	The ability to be able to do or control something.
Priest	A man who serves God and his people in a special way.



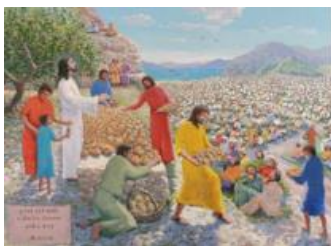
